15 CHARACTERISTICS OF AN IDEAL BROTHER

1.KNOWLEDGE OF PHI SIGMA PI

 Each Member should possess a commanding knowledge and understanding of the National Fraternity, its purpose, goals, regulations and policies.

2.DESIRE TO SERVE

• Every Member will be an asset to the group if there is a deep sense of commitment to the welfare of the organization.

3.DEVOTION OF TIME AND ENERGY

• Each Member must be willing to sacrifice and make time for the advancement of the organization.

4.ACCEPT RESPONSIBILITY

• By accepting the responsibilities of membership, each member can make positive contributions to the group.

5.WORK WITH OTHERS IN TEAM SPIRIT

 Cooperation is the key to success for any group. Remember that this is a democracy, even though you may not agree with a decision of the majority, you are committed to supporting it.

6.DILIGENCE AND MOTIVATION

• When duties are assigned, Members must see that their part is accomplished thoroughly and in a timely manner.

7.LEARN TO TAKE CRTICISM

• You must learn to sort out the constructive (from which you can learn) from the malicious (which you must ignore).

8.ABILITY TO FACE ADVERSITY

• A good leader learns from mistakes and to take things in stride.

9.MAKE DECISIONS

 Leadership involves making decisionssometimes tough decisions- on a regular basis. You must be prepared to take a stand for the good of the Chapter.
